Beit Uri, Afula

Beit Uri is a residential village home to about 120 children and adults with multiple disabilities including autism, cerebral palsy, Down Syndrome, hyperactivity, hearing and visual impairments and behavioural disorders.

The village has six residential buildings and is surrounded by a beautiful forest used daily for therapeutic activities.

Beit Uri also offers a school programme serving residents up to the age of 21. The programme emphasises creative education in subjects such as art and music, teaching students self expression. The school is also open to external pupils from the local community.

Other residents work in the vegetable garden and make hand-crafted goods including ceramics, baskets and candles, which are sold as part of a social enterprise. A few residents have been trained in the necessary skills to find employment outside the village in Afula.



Early Childhood Centre, Yerucham



JNF UK is proud to be developing an Early Childhood Centre in Yerucham. The Centre will cater for babies and children up to the age of six by providing subsidised day care, a wellbeing clinic and an after-school programme.

This inclusive Centre will also cater for children with physical or psychological issues. Furthermore, the Centre will enable low-income parents to return to work with confidence, knowing that their children are in safe hands.

This vital project will make a positive impact on Yerucham's low income community which currently faces a lack of infrastructure as well as poor medical facilities. Through early investment in children, the Centre will target the root of poverty and create opportunities for a brighter future for Yerucham's residents.
